Kindergarten Registration

If your child will be age five by August 31, 2016, save the date for Clarkston's Kindergarten registration! From April 6 to May 2, all parents/guardians of incoming Clarkston kindergarten students should register their child at the elementary school he/she will be attending in the fall.

Kindergarten registration in Clarkston for the 2016-2017 school year will take place from 9 AM to 3 PM each day in Clarkston's elementary schools. To register a child, parents **MUST** bring the child's birth certificate and immunization record.

During registration, parents will make an appointment for the Kindergarten Round-Up. The Round-Up lasts from May 3rd to the 6th at the Clarkston School District Office. Look for more info on the Round-Up coming soon.
