From the Parent Handbook:

Excused and Unexcused Absences: Students are expected to attend all classes each day. The following are valid excuses for absences and tardiness:

- Participation in school-approved activity.
- Absence due to illness, health condition, family emergency or religious purposes, court, judicial proceeding.
- Absence for parental-approved activities.
- Absence resulting from disciplinary actions, or short-term suspension
- Extended illness or health condition.
- Excused absence for chronic health condition.

Assignments and/or activities not completed because of an excused absence or tardiness may be made up in the manner provided by the teacher.

*If your student is sick or needs to be excused from school, please phone, email or send a note with your student the following day.
